## HOW TO READ THE PROGRAM CODES

The **first digit** refers to the *day*:

- 1 = Monday, July 11<sup>th</sup>
- 2 = Tuesday, July 12<sup>th</sup>
- 3 = Wednesday, July 13<sup>th</sup>
- 4 = Thursday, July 14<sup>th</sup>
- 5 = Friday, July 15<sup>th</sup>

The **second digit** refers to the *time slot* (1-2 in the morning, 3-4 in the afternoon):

- 1 = *first lecture slot* (plenary on Monday and Wednesday; parallel other days)
- 2 = *second lecture slot* (plenary on Monday and Wednesday; parallel other days)
- 3 = *third lecture slot* (always parallel)
